


Read, Write Inc.

Illness and Home Learning



The beginning of this term has presented us with some challenges in terms of illness in school. Thank you to all our families for their understanding and cooperation, following additional letters I have sent out. Please can families continue to keep a close eye on their children in case any symptoms of either Covid or sickness and diarrhoea develop. Additionally, another reminder that if your child has any sickness or diarrhoea, they must stay off school for 48 hours after they were last poorly. We have been in regular contact with Wirral Public Health School Support this week to ensure we are doing everything we can as a school community at this time.

If your child is isolating due to testing positive for Covid, but is still well enough to learn, home learning will be set by their class teachers (for children in F2-Y6), and sent to you over Class Dojos. This is so children do not miss out on learning if they are well enough to complete it. If you have any questions about this, please contact class teachers on Dojos.
