

Curriculum Intent

<u>Subject: RE</u>

At Kingsway Primary, we follow the Wirral Syllabus which aims at providing a framework that places value on the ethos, morality and cultural understanding that religious education can establish. Each unit of work challenges pupils' thinking as part of an inquiry based approach, each unit responding to the big questions. This is a whole school approach and covers the EYFS statutory framework and the National Curriculum. As a school, we engage pupils and teach them to understand the significance of beliefs and values that shape the modern world, taking into account the impact it has on different lives and communities. It's extremely important for our students to understand that their world-view is one of many.

During pupils' time at Kingsway Primary School, pupils are invited to participate in key Christian festivals, such as Harvest, Christmas and Easter. In addition to this we celebrate through singing in weekly assemblies and enjoy learning about festivals on a more global scale such as Zakat and Hanukkah.

Aims and Objectives:

The national curriculum for music aims to ensure that all pupils:

- ✓ To recognise and analyse connections between different religions
- ✓ Make informed comments about religious issues
- ✓ Develop knowledge and understanding of a range of religions and beliefs
- ✓ Carry out enquiries into the world of religions and beliefs
- ✓ To behave in a sensitive manner towards those who have different religions or beliefs or to those with no beliefs
- ✓ To develop their own beliefs, ideas and practises
- ✓ To engage with questions raised about religions and beliefs
